### Welcome Iraqi Activist Raed Jarrar!

Sunday, January 24<sup>th</sup>, 12:45 PM, Frothingham Library

Raed Jarrar, Iraqi activist, author, architect, and political analyst, will speak on the upcoming elections and refugee crisis in Iraq. There will be time for Q & A and discussion.

Mr. Jarrar worked on humanitarian and reconstruction projects before leaving Iraq and immigrating to the US in 2005. He has been an outspoken advocate for ending the US occupation through numerous public speaking engagements, media appearances, and publications. During his time in the US, he has facilitated dialogue between US and Iraqi decision-makers to ensure a fast and complete US withdrawal from Iraq. Mr. Jarrar leaked and translated the infamous new Iraqi hydrocarbon law, and the US-Iraqi security agreement— SOFA. He is currently a Senior Fellow with Peace Action.
