The Journal method is a remarkable and efficient way to open up new horizons in your life. This Spiritual Passion will show you different kinds of journals, and how they can be used for specific results. Learn how to write dialogues to work through difficult situations; lists of 100; "springboards;" steppingstones for clarifying thoughts and finding solutions; "topics du jour" to reflect on work and career problems; "journals to go" for ways to write in under 15 minutes, and many more techniques! Many of these journal exercises include an "entrance meditation" that allows you to clarify your thoughts before you put pen to paper. Journaling calls us to journey with our inner self, with humanity, and our own spirituality. Let the journey begin!

### **Spiritual Retreat in the Wilderness - An Arctic Sojourn**

Sunday, March 15<sup>th</sup>, 1:00 PM, in the Hunnewell Chapel

Since childhood, nature has taught Lois spiritual lessons. In August 2008, she went on a women's wilderness camping trip to Gates of the Arctic National Park, which is in Alaska, north of the arctic circle. She will share her experiences of living in an area where the only human impact has been from nomadic hunter and gatherer cultures. On the last day of her trip, a grizzly bear came to the campsite, and one woman was mauled. She survived due to heroic efforts of the trip guides and all of the members. Discussion will consider lessons of 1) living with limited control of our environment; 2) appreciating the scale of wilderness in comparison to human experience; 3) discovering our true self by looking at the awesome beauty in wilderness and our vulnerability as humans.

### Inside Out Concert: Chamber of Dreams

Sunday, March 29<sup>th</sup>, 2009, 1:30 PM in the Sanctuary

The *Inside Out* Concert Series returns to Arlington Street Church with a **world premiere performance** of Boston composer Dalit Warshaw's "Chamber of Dreams!" Artistic Director Eli Epstein is joined by violinist Sharan Leventhal and Arlington Street's own Karl Paulnack on piano.

The *Inside Out* concert series is rooted in the belief that classical music can be a tremendous resource for understanding oneself and others. It's food for our minds, hearts and souls. Yet, for most of the American population, classical music is often intangible, mysterious, and undiscovered.

*Inside Out* builds bridges to audiences by showing that a connection with music is not so much about knowing (although it's useful to know the historical and cultural context of a piece), it's more about tapping into the emotional essence and universal human experience that's inherent in every work of art, be it music, dance, theatre, film, or visual art. This innovative interdisciplinary approach helps concertgoers access their memories and activate their imaginations so that they can have more moving, meaningful, and personal experiences.
