Today's Speaker

Rev. Vera O'Brien is an interfaith chaplain at Brigham and Women's Hospital where she feels blessed to work primarily with palliative care and cancer patients. She co-leads a small group of volunteers and is involved in a variety of educational activities of chaplains and physicians. Rev. Vera is our Affiliated Community Minister and our former Lifespan Educator. She is a proud graduate of Meadville Lombard Theological School (a UU seminary) and was joyfully ordained at ASC.

Speaking on Sunday, July 26th

The Perversity of Diversity Rev. Dr. Mark Morrison-Reed
and featuring the Unitarian Universalist Musicians Network

Reverend Dr. Mark Morrison-Reed, who hails from Chicago, joined the Chicago Children's Choir in 1957 (the second year of its existence) and was the second African-American child to sing in that fine chorus. He earned his M.A. from the University of Chicago and his D.Min from Meadville Lombard Theological School. He served as co-minister with his wife, Donna Morrison-Reed, in Rochester, NY and Toronto, Canada. Currently he is an Affiliated Faculty at Meadville Lombard and Coordinator of its Sankofa Archive. He is recognized as the premier historian of the African-American experience in UUism. In much demand as a preacher, he has spoken at over 200 UU congregations and conferences in Canada, the U.S. and Europe.

UUMN is a professional organization of the Unitarian Universalist Association. We were founded in 1983 to develop and enrich music ministry in the denomination and to support the musicians

who carry out this vital work. Our current 600 plus membership encompasses both professional and lay musicians, largely from North America.
