## Pre-Release Screening of "The Innocent Convicts" Today ~ 2:00 PM, Parish Hall

In anticipation of a November debut, Boston-based filmmaker and investigative reporter Osagie "Ossy" Okoruwa comes to Arlington Street Church to present a segment of his feature length film, "The Innocent Convicts." This past July, the National Registry of Exonerations listed that, of the thousands of people who have been

cleared of wrongful convictions in the past 25 years, 47 percent were black and 40 percent had been falsely incarcerated for at least 10 years before exoneration. Mr. Okoruwa's film could not be more timely. See it - and meet him - before the film's November release!



## **Channing: A Rededication**

Today ~ 2:00 PM, Mt. Auburn Cemetery, Cambridge (meet at Story Chapel)

In the early nineteenth century, William Ellery Channing (born in 1780) was the foremost Unitarian preacher in the U.S. and one of Unitarianism's leading theologians. He served this congregation from 1803 until his death in 1842, when his parishioners erected a beautiful monument in his honor at Mt. Auburn Cemetery. In recent years, his grave site had fallen into disrepair. A recent campaign to restore it to its former glory was a resounding success. Join Rev. Kim and Unitarian Universalists from across the Commonwealth in a celebration of this critical restoration and of Channing's great legacy. - \* Staff from Pink and Co, for a review of the progress on the construction of our accessibility ramp.

The Pru considered (surmountable) challenges in completing additional permitting and in identifying a construction contractor. The Pru discussed construction funding options, and agreed to work toward a funding approach that ties into overall strategic planning for the church.
