Second Ask Sunday

As most of you know, our budget for this fiscal year was based in part on a Covenant Renewal goal of \$285,000. At the half-way point in the year, we're behind in pledges by 17%, or \$50,000. In an effort to bridge this gap, the Finance Committee has decided to come back to the congregation for a Second Ask.

The Finance Committee first approached the lay leadership of the church and asked them to consider increasing their pledges by 10% - 20%. They have stepped up and responded generously and enthusiastically, increasing their pledges by an average of 25%, which reduced the gap to about \$45,000.

We realize that these are extraordinarily difficult economic times. But trusting in your spirit and connection to the community, we ask each of you to consider increasing your pledge for this year to help us reach our goal. We can do this. By way of example, our average pledge is \$1,000. If everyone increased his or her pledge by 20%, we could reach our Covenant Renewal goal of \$285,000.

If you did not make a Covenant Renewal pledge for this fiscal year, please consider making a gift for the next five months (February – July 2009). Thank you!
