Founded in 1964, the group has evolved to be truly unique among handbell ensembles in that the ringers do not use tables or gloves, and they perform from memory without a conductor. They have performed throughout the world, including at Carnegie Hall with Skitch Henderson and the New York Pops, and at the Vatican for Pope John Paul II. The choir's members are all students from middle school through college.
