March Share the Plate Recipient: Only a Child

We share half of the morning's offering with a community partner in our mission of love, service, justice, and peace. The recipient for March is Only a Child, which was founded in 1993 by Arlington Street member George Leger.

Only a Child serves street kids in in Guatemala City with a shelter, carpentry shop, and education program. The shelter, which houses a dozen young men, is far more than a place to sleep; it provides a surrogate family to support the youth in developing responsibility, confidence, and self-esteem.

In addition to attending school, all of the residents work, many of them in the on-site shop, where they learn carpentry skills and produce finely crafted cedar boxes that are sold to support the program.

Arlington Street Church has supported the program from its inception. In a bid to maximize the kids' chances to leave the streets once and for all, we have sponsored their tuition at high-quality independent schools and at university.
