MARCH SHARE THE PLATE: STANDING TOGETHER ~ OMDIM BEYACHAD-NAQIF MA'AN

Standing Together is comprised of Jewish and Palestinian citizens of Israel who, in their own words, are "fighting for the soul and humanity of our society and for freedom and peace for all. Our future here is shared, and in order to guarantee a life here for all of us, we must do it together.... The harsh reality is that decades of [the current policies] have not made anyone any safer — not Jews, and not

Palestinians. It is crucial that our society begins to understand that the only way to achieve security is through peace — and as long as we aren't working toward that, nobody will ever have security." After the October 7th attacks, they wrote: "Prolonged war = Palestinians in Gaza continue to die; Israeli hostages' lives are put at risk. Ceasefire agreement and hostage release deal = Save innocent lives in Gaza; hostages return home alive. It's actually that simple. It's either both of us or neither of us."
