Between 2020 and 2023, many people from Arlington Street participated in "Beloved Conversations *Within*," a program of Meadville Lombard Theological School which involves learning about racism and ethnicity. *Within* is done on Zoom and includes different curricula for white people and for BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color). Participants met in learning pods with individuals from all over the United States. If this piques your interest, the *Within* program is ongoing and offered twice yearly, in the spring and the fall.

In 2023, the Arlington Street Church Transformation Team for Racial Justice applied to do "Beloved Conversations *Among*." Between 2023 and 2025, the *Among* program will address racial justice issues and congregation-wide change. The *Among* team includes twenty people who completed *Within* and are working with a coach from First Parish Dorchester (Rev. Elka Carrier-Ladd). This work is for the whole Arlington Street Church congregation and the *Among* team hopes for your support and participation.

Today, members of the *Among* team – familiar faces to many of you – will share our covenant. To begin, you will hear from *Among* team member Lois Hartsough, who believed in the work so much that she provided the financial support to make it possible.

### Arlington Street Church Among Covenant

### Purpose

We, the members of the Arlington Street Church *Among* Team, will work to make our Among Team and our broader spiritual community a safer space for people of color to enter and to thrive, a place for liberation and justice, and a place for all to grow in anti-racism.

We believe community and caring is more important than productivity.

We will center the needs and voices of BIPOC and strive to actively create more space for BIPOC members of the group.

We will be transformed in the service of the work.

### **Presence and Participation**

We will be open-minded, not defensive, and we will work from a place of caring.

We will practice radical hospitality; we will make space, take space, and share space.

We recognize that, if we share often, we can allow ourselves to be silent; and, if we tend to be silent, we can allow ourselves to find our voices.

We will respect each other's identities, stories, and boundaries.

We believe there is no one right way.

We will reflect, be curious, be our whole selves, and be brave in facing our fear of making mistakes.

We will do our best to avoid making assumptions.

We will learn from each other and teach each other, sharing ideas, experience, and wisdom.

We believe each person's experience has meaning.

We believe there is always enough time to do the right work.

### **Conflict Resolution**

We recognize that harm is inevitable and repair is possible. When we cause harm to one another, we commit to repair the conflict individually, with support, and communally.

We will approach mistakes, failures, and conflict as opportunities for growth.

We will use conflict resolution as an opportunity for kindness, growth, shared leadership, and open and honest communication.

We will communicate clearly, openly, and honestly; we will keep issues from getting too big.
