### Today's Speaker

**HARRIOTTE HURIE RANVIG**, PhD in ethnomusicology, Hindustani vocalist, disability advocacy and awareness trainer, lover of languages, and mother of two young adults, Maya and Keeler, who grew up within Arlington Street Church. Harriotte was born in Yellow Springs, Ohio and grew up in Valdosta, GA. After a minor fall at six and a half, Harriotte began losing her sight and was home schooled for five years, during which time she became blind, but as she puts it, not that pitch black scary BLIND, that people talk about. She attended a tiny Waldorf High School in Wilton, NH, the original Antioch College, and Wesleyan University. Harriotte settled in the Boston area in 1980. Most recently, Harriotte has been teaching "discovering Indian Music in greater Boston" and Conversational Hindi at Tufts University. Harriotte discovered ASC through Joan Goodwin's daughter Anne and became a committee member on the access committee, before becoming a church member in 1993.
