Random Acts of Kindness Harlow Robinson

Harlow Robinson is an author, lecturer and professor of history at Northeastern University. Harlow has been a proud member of ASC since 2003, and has served on the Worship Committee and the Prudential Committee. He and his husband Robert Holley were married at ASC in 2004.

Harlow's sermon explores the idea of kindness in everyday life as a spiritual practice. When we perform acts of kindness, both spontaneous and planned, we put into action concepts central to the UU tenets of service. When we receive acts of kindness, we experience grace.
