Rebecca is currently beginning her final year in a Master of Divinity Program at Harvard Divinity School.

Special Service on Sunday, September 11th

A special multi-congregational service will mark the passing of ten years since 9/11. The vision is for all the congregations of the Back Bay (as well as our good friend, Bilal Kaleem, and members of the Muslim American Society) to worship together in an hour-long, interfaith service of memory and hope at 11AM on 9/11. The service will happen outside, on Copley Square or, (in the unlikely case of

rain), inside Trinity Church – a space that could hold the anticipated 1,000 participants!

Our usual Homecoming Sunday service will happen the following week on September 18th.

Massachusetts Remembers September I Ith

Sunday, September IIth ~ 3:00-5:00 PM, Hatch Shell, Charles River

In addition to our participation at the 11AM service in Copley Square, Arlington Street church has been part of the Massachusetts Interfaith Leadership Coalition's planning for a larger afternoon gathering at the Hatch Shell to commemorate the 10th anniversary of 9/11.

The Massachusetts Interfaith Coalition will open and close this *Massachusetts Remembers* tribute to America's heroes and the fallen from that tragic day. The program will include music performed by the Boston Pops Brass Ensemble and the Boston Children's Chorus, as well as readings and a time for reflection and remembrance.

Massachusetts Remembers will serve as the culmination point for the 'Beyond the Bike Ride' fundraiser for the families of 9/11. The bike ride begins at Ground Zero in New York City and ends in Boston at the Hatch Shell at the start of the afternoon program.

A community service area will display information about dozens of non-profits and charitable causes created by 9/11 family members, as well as other community based non-profits, enabling the public to learn about and engage in ongoing service opportunities.

Also on display will be a giant mural of the American flag created by Massachusetts school children shortly after September 11, 2001. The mural, half the size of a football field, is comprised of over 50,000 individual red, white, and blue 6-inch squares of fabric, each displaying a message of peace, hope and patriotism.

Please come and join with people from many faiths at this momentous commemoration.
