

Animal companions in the Zoom room will be spotlighted for all to see, and another special camera will capture the incarnate beasts as they stroll around the sanctuary. The choir will sing Eric Whitacre's setting of three hilarious poems from Ogden Nash's *Animal Crackers*, and soloists Hannah Shanefield and Bek Zehr will sing *Duetto Buffo di Due Gatti (Humorous Duet for Two Cats)*. Prepare yourself!

Somewhere in there, I'll preach — my sermon is called *Reteaching Loveliness* — and then we'll all lay hands on our animal companions and offer a blessing. The service concludes with the hymn attributed to Saint Francis of Assisi and a resounding, joyous *Alleluia!*
