*The Wednesdays* season concludes with a one-day Emily Dickinson extravaganza! Join Prof. Alan Helms and Kim for an evening's introduction to the prolific and terrifically gifted poet of Amherst. We will be reading *Final Harvest: Emily Dickinson's Poems*, edited by Thomas H. Johnson (Little, Brown). Aficionados, the uninitiated, and the rest of us are all welcome!

### Here's your assignment from Professor Helms! Join us!

Dickinson never titled her poems, so the convention is to call them after their first lines. Here are those lines/titles, followed by the number of the poem in the edition I recommend (*Final Harvest* edited by Thomas Johnson), followed by the number of the poem in parentheses, which refers to the authoritative *The Complete Poems of Emily Dickinson*, also edited by Johnson.

#### Love note from Alan:

That's sixteen poems, which may seem like a lot *but* a) they're all short and b) we have a two hour class/funfest.
