Some highlights from the monthly meeting of the Prudential Committee, governing board of Arlington Street Church.

- Doug Fiero provided an update on the project to display two of our Tiffany Windows watercolors at MOBIA, the Museum of Biblical Art in New York City, scheduled for October, 2012.
- The Pru voted to approve the proposed bid for a chair lift which will provide accessibility from the Hunnewell Chapel, to the office level, and on to the parish hall.
- The Pru selected the NO AIDS Kitchen at First Unitarian Universalist Church of New Orleans, Only a Child, and other Jubilee organizations as 2012 recipients of the Fund-A-Dream (formerly known as Fund-A-Need) money to be raised at Indulge this March.
