One way to live your values regarding sustainable small farm practices and humane treatment of animals that provide our food is to shop for grassfed meat and milk. Yes, it costs a bit more, but maybe you are eating less of it. Even partial changes make a difference.

American Grassfed Association (AGA) standards require open pasture, humane animal care, no antibiotics and no hormones; they are intended to support healthy meats - and animals - and American family farms. <u>http://www.americangrassfed.org</u>
