Tiffany Windows Watercolor Show

October 20th to January 20th ~ Museum of Biblical Art, New York City Did you know that Arlington Street Church owns nine original watercolors done by well-known Tiffany artist, Frederick Wilson? These were created for donors of the "Beatitudes" Tiffany windows on the upper level of our Sanctuary.

MOBIA, the Museum of Biblical Art, is new, small, modern, and non-denominational, located at 1865 Broadway, just a few blocks from Lincoln Center. MOBIA concentrates on art derived from the Bible and all religious traditions. A show entitled "The Devotional Art of Louis C. Tiffany" will include two of our original watercolors; one from another of our upstairs windows will be featured in the show.

As part of the contract, MOBIA paid for the conservation of our two works on exhibition. We need to raise funds to conserve the remaining seven watercolors! In addition, if there is enough interest, we might try to do a "road trip" to NYC to see the Tiffany show, with an opportunity to do some Christmas shopping, see a show, or just visit "The Big Apple."
