Each November, the worldwide transgender community turns its attention to family, friends, and loved ones lost to violence and prejudice. A tradition inspired by the Allston MA vigil for slain transsexual Rita Hester in 1998, this day has become the worldwide rallying point for a community long under siege. This year hundreds of observances will be held in dozens of countries. Boston's transgender community remembers local victims Chanelle Pickett, Debra Forte, Monique Thomas, Georgette Hart, Denise Pugliesi, Monique Rogers, Lisa Daniels, Rita Hester, and too many more, mostly uncounted and unnoticed by all but their friends and family

This free event features speakers, performances, a community speak-out, candlelight vigil, and a reception.
