## **Pru in Review**

The Prudential Committee met on October 18th. Some highlights from the meeting are below. Feel free to contact us anytime with questions at prudential@ascboston.org.

- Staffing changes: Jeffrey Bouchard was promoted to Congregational Administrator. Jeffrey's new title reflects a shift in responsibilities after the departure of our Business Administrator. With Jeffrey's increased role and the assistance of our publication specialist (Laurinda O'Connor) and accountant/bookkeeper (Adam Berman), church operations are proceeding relatively well, and there are no immediate plans to hire a replacement Business Administrator. The Finance Committee is investigating potential savings from the staffing changes.
- Buildings and Grounds: The Pru heard a presentation on the windows conservation project, and voted to approve the purchase of LED light bulbs to replace incandescent lamps in the church. Progress on construction of the Boylston St. accessibility ramp has been stalled by red tape.
- **Bylaws:** Non-discrimination language for the bylaws was discussed. It is anticipated that an amendment to the bylaws will be proposed at the next corporation meeting.

# A Study Group Based on UU Principles: Palestine sand Israel

Perhaps no other issue challenges our UU principles—to support human rights and social justice—than the Israeli Palestinian question. In a talk given during General Assembly last June, Rabbi Brian Walt said: "At its root it is a struggle insuring that everyone gets equal rights." For those of you who are interested, a study group based on the UUJME (UUs for Justice in the Middle East) curriculum on Justice in Israel-Palestine will start in February 2015.
