Join Professor Alan Helms and Rev. Kim to discuss Walt Whitman's "Song of Myself," one of the masterpieces of world literature. He said women matter as much as men, black people matter as much as white people, and sex is nothing to be ashamed of but something to be celebrated, and he's refreshingly irreverent, as when he claims that "The scent of these armpits is aroma finer than prayer," the line which caused Oliver Wendell Holmes to throw his copy in the fireplace. Outside the United States, Whitman is recognized as the peer of Shakespeare, Homer, and Dante. Come one and all to find out why!

This book has slightly different titles, but basically you want *Leaves of Grass*, the Original Edition, (Penguin paperback, usually). You'll find many copies for a penny at Amazon & ABEBooks, or for free at the public library. Please be sure to read Cowley's "Introduction" before our first meeting.
