They won that case, which set off a battle on Beacon Hill that ended with Massachusetts being the first state to recognize full Marriage Equality. S*p*iritual Passions **Higher & Friendly Power: William James and Addiction**

Sunday, May 4th ~ 12:30 PM, Hunnewell Chapel

Please attend this Spiritual Passion led by Peg O'Connor, professor of philosophy at Gustavus Adolphus College and the author of the Psychology Today blog, "Philosophy Stirred, Not Shaken: Philosophy and Addiction." Peg has written several pieces for The New York Times on addiction and is a recovering alcoholic.

The philosopher/psychologist William James and his great work, The Varieties of Religious Experience (1902), had a profound influence on the founding of Alcoholics Anonymous. This talk introduces James's concepts of "surrender," "conversion," "habitual centers of personal energy," "misery thresholds," "world sickness," "higher and friendly power," "healthy-mindedness," and "practical fruits of the spiritual tree." In a time of increasing addiction rates, William James is a most welcome companion and guide to anyone struggling with addiction or living a life of recovery.

The Wednesdays Literary Salon with Professor Alan Helms ~ Alice Munro

Wednesdays, May 14th, 21st, 28th ~ 6:00-8:00 PM, Frothingham Library For my money, Alice Munro is the best living writer in English. She just won the Nobel Prize in Literature, the first time in its hundred years plus history that the prize has been given to a short story writer. Her style is graceful, deft, and clear; her psychological acuity brilliant; her story-telling prowess unequalled; and her humanity profound. To read an Alice Munro story is to enter a world that is strange yet familiar, and then to leave it deeply moved, sometimes shaken, always enlightened with a larger sense of life. Please join Rev. Kim and me for three glorious encounters with this transcendent writer.

Our text is Munro's first collection of short stories: Dance of the Happy Shades. You'll find over 20 copies on Amazon for \$12-16, and most public libraries will have it.
