Tuesday, July 12th - Thursday, July 28th

Arlington Street Church will again be working with the Haitian Coalition during its second humanitarian trip to Haiti. This trip has a two-pronged mission. We will collaborate with individuals living in Camp Caradeux to replace the deteriorating tent school with a new four-classroom school outfitted with amenities that foster learning. Second, a team of medical volunteers will provide assistance to earthquake victims by holding medical and psychological clinics in the camp while outreaching to other areas. The team will deliver workshops on health education, substance abuse, skills building, and other topics. The cost is \$300 per week plus airfare. The deadline for signing up is June 1st.
