Mark Twain is one of the most all-around satisfying writers who ever wrote; few provide as much sentence-to-sentence pleasure. Hemingway famously said that "All modern American literature comes from one book by Mark Twain called *Huckleberry Finn*," but he might as easily have said the same about *Tom Sawyer*, published eight years earlier. Although the later book deals with the far more important subject of slavery and is thus thematically richer, *Tom Sawyer* can lay claim to being perhaps the first truly American novel.
