From the Czech Republic: Reconciliation and Healing

Sunday June 18th ~ 12:30-2:00 PM, Hunnewell Chapel

Peter Lowber (of the Low-Beer family) will show slides and have a discussion about his recent trip to Brno, Czech Republic. Over 100 Low-Beer family members from all over the world gathered for a four day event sponsored by the town of Brno. The family gathering was part of the town's Reconciliation and Healing for Jews, German-speaking Czechs, and Czech Czechs. Although some escaped, most Jews in Czechoslovakia were murdered by the Nazis in the Holocaust. After the War, 2.9 million German-speaking Czechs were expelled. The Czech Republic was established in 1992 after the Soviet Union collapsed. All are welcome!


Intersectional Book Discussion
