The American Guild of Organists, Rodger Vine, and Arlington Street Church present a New Year's Eve organ recital! Three organists, Brink Bush, G. Fredrick Guzasky, and Lois Toepfner, will share in the program, playing 20 minutes each. The concert showcases Arlington Street Church's 1957 Aeolian-Skinner organ, housed in a magnificent case original to the E. and G.G. Hook organ of 1861; the Hook case pipes still provide the organ's foundation sound.

This will be the 33rd First Night Boston. Founded in 1976, First Night was started by artists who sought an alternative to traditional New Year's Eve revelry. First Night has gone from attracting about 25,000 people to drawing crowds of over one million people.

Friday Night Supper Program, Inc **Help your homeless and hungry neighbors!**

The Friday Night Supper Program has been serving meals to over 150 disadvantaged people every Friday evening, never missing a single week, serving on holidays and through snow, storms, and power outages for almost 25 years. Here are two important ways in which you can support the Friday Night Supper Program:

SUPPORT OUR ANNUAL HOLIDAY BAGS

Each December, during our holiday meal, we distribute a holiday bag to our guests consisting of the following:

1. Warm item of clothing – men’s hat, gloves, or scarf
2. Toiletries - shampoo, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste
3. Pair of men’s socks
4. Holiday candy

You can support this annual tradition by donating warm clothing and toiletries. You can also create a holiday bag with the above items which we will give to a guest on your behalf. In the past year the Friday Night Supper Program has seen the cost for a weekly meal go up thirty percent from \$900 to \$1,200.
