Fugue in C Minor (1928)

Rodger Vine, Organ

*Maurice Duruflé*

Maurice Duruflé won the “Premier Prix” in Fugue as a student at the Paris Conservatory in 1928. It was one of five first prizes he won in various subjects while he was a student there in the 1920s. This *Fugue in C Minor*, written as a final examination on a submitted fugue subject (theme), was composed without the aid of any musical instrument, at a desk, within a maximum of 6 hours. The dictionary definition of a fugue is “a contrapuntal composition in which the theme is introduced in one part, repeated by other parts, and subjected to complex development.” This fugue by Duruflé is perfect in every aspect of its development, obviously written by a musical genius. It was recently “uncovered” by James Frazier, who is completing a new biography of Maurice Duruflé. It has never been published as an organ composition, and has undoubtedly never been played in the United States before today.
