Roger Charles Peltier has been honored by the three congregations with whom he has practiced ministry. The Governing Boards of all three congregations have voted to recommend ordination, and the congregation of the Arlington Street Church has fulfilled the legal requirement by voting unanimously as follows:

November 20th, 2005:

We, the Members, affirm that Arlington Street Church approves ordaining Roger Charles Peltier, on April 30th, 2006.

To celebrate that unity of action, we ask the members of all three congregations to rise and take part as you will in the act of ordination. Please rise as you are able.

Arthur Smith, Bedford: We gather today to ordain Roger Charles Peltier to the Unitarian Universalist ministry, and in a spirit of mutual concern to rededicate ourselves to the values of our religious communities and to the liberal religious tradition of which they are a part.

Claire Cerrato, Framingham: Through his contributions to the profession of ministry, Roger will enable us to affirm our belief in the importance of ministry, and to brighten our hopes and aspirations for the future. Our purpose in taking part in this ordination can only be realized if we as a people acknowledge our own continuing obligations of loyalty, truth, and love.

Sarah Richards, ASC: Are we ready to rededicate ourselves to these obligations?

Congregations: We are ready to rededicate ourselves to the obligations of loyalty, truth, and love, and to fulfill them to the best of our ability in the congregations of which we are members.

Sarah Richards, ASC: Roger Charles Peltier, we offer you ordination, a privilege bestowed upon us by the nature of our free church. Among us, and wherever you may be called to serve, we would have you bring the word of truth in freedom and in love, ministering alike to our joys and sorrows, setting forth no less by your example and by your presence, by precept of the principles of our free faith. Are you ready to take up the ministry as an ordained Unitarian Universalist minister?

Roger Charles Peltier: I am.

Congregations: We, the members of the Arlington Street Church, and with the support of members from the congregations of Bedford and Framingham, do hereby ordain you, Roger Charles Peltier, to the Unitarian Universalist ministry. We do pledge ourselves to walk with you in unity of spirit, in the bonds of peace, and in the ways of truth, service and love.

Roger Charles Peltier: It is with joy and appreciation that I now accept this ordination with a deep sense of obligation and opportunity. Ever mindful of its privileges and its responsibilities, I shall endeavor to take up the ministry to which you ordain me. I will keep alive the meanings of this service so that my ministry and my life will be enriched by the spirit and trust we have given one another.
