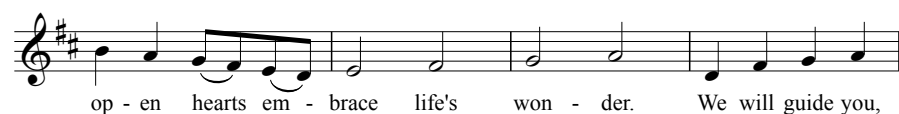

COMMUNITY CANDLES OF SORROW & JOY

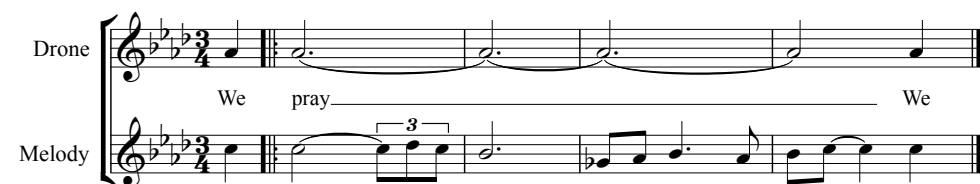
