

A Note on Today's Anthem

This piece incorporates elements of Tai Chi Chuan and Qigong practice into the choral setting. The Qigong meditative practice called the Six Healing Sounds begins and ends the work. The melodic text is from the Classical Chinese text, Tao Te Ching (The Way of Virtue).

The Six Healing Sounds is a Qigong breathing technique in which there are six ways to exhale improving health and promoting healing and longevity. The earliest notation of them appears in a book called On Caring for the Health of the Mind and Prolonging the Life Span written by Tao Hongjing. It dates to the Northern and Southern dynasties (420 - 589 CE). In traditional Chinese Medicine, each of the sounds corresponds to the six major functions of the body to help regulate the flow of qi and bring vitality.
