

### **Share the Plate: Hurricane Maria Relief**

On September 20th, Maria made landfall as a Category Five Hurricane and tore through the Northeastern Caribbean, leaving catastrophic damage in its wake. Since that time, Vieques, a small island off Puerto Rico, home to 9,000 people, has been almost entirely cut off from help. There is no electricity and no phone service. The *New York Times* reported that when Humane Society workers arrived, intending to focus on animal care, the situation was so dire they began organizing humanitarian flights.

In the absence of federal assistance, an entirely volunteer initiative called Vieques Love was formed on the mainland. As of today, volunteers flew four satellite phones to the island, stocked a free pharmacy at the Vieques hospital, amassed and delivered more than 11,000 pounds of supplies including 3,000 pounds of baby formula and diapers, delivered fuel to the island to get the water treatment plant back on line, evacuated residents in need of medical care, made an animal food delivery, and installed \$100,000 worth of solar technology this week to light up public spaces and boost morale on the island.
