Share the Plate: Larry Kessler, Founder of Boston's AIDS Action Committee

In 1983, Larry Kessler founded Boston's AIDS Action Committee after the first cases of the virus showed up here. AIDS Action served over half of all people diagnosed with AIDS in Massachusetts; educated generations about the disease; and secured progressive city, state, and federal AIDS policy.

Larry's storied career paralleled the trajectory of the AIDS epidemic, from the horrible days when it was a death sentence to now, when it can be managed, though not cured, with the help of drugs.

Larry retired in 2006, and then, seven years later, accepted the job of rebuilding the Boston Living Center for people living with AIDS. At the age of 73, with that success behind him, he retired again.

On May 4th, Larry was admitted to Beth Israel Hospital for a knee replacement. He contracted an infection, and has endured six readmissions to the hospital. He's in rehab now, learning to use a wheelchair, and can only come home after his house has been retrofitted with accessibile accommodations. The price tag is north of \$50k.

Our gifts in the offering plate today will go to a GoFundMe campaign, established by former AIDS Action employees. There is less than \$5,700 left to raise and construction can begin! As one donor to Larry's campaign wrote, "This man has made a difference in all our lives ... Even if you have not been directly touched by AIDS, somebody you care about has. And this man helped."
