

- Kindergarten-2nd graders, Nancy, and Laura are making a giant timeline of important people and events from the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960s to the Civil Rights Movement of today.
- 2nd-5th graders, Dan, and Erica are learning about some of the women and men who marched from Selma to Montgomery in 1965.
- 5th-8th graders and Sarah are using the Unitarian Universalist Association Selma study guide and Sweet Honey in the Rock's "Ella's Song" to reflect on the social impact of the march and social action today.
