



### **ABOUT TODAY'S MUSICAL GUESTS**

Gamelankemana aims to take Balinese gamelan to new places--both physically and musically--by reinterpreting traditional repertoire and bringing it to new audiences. The ensemble is based on a form of Balinese music called gender wayang, which is played by a quartet of bronze metallophones and used to accompany shadow-puppet plays. Even in Bali, this style of music is considered extremely demanding because the players must play independent interlocking parts with both hands, while also using their palms and fingers to dampen the keys after they are struck. The pieces in today's program do not have known composers, as they have developed over many generations as part of an oral tradition, but they came to our group from a master performer and teacher named I Wayan Suweca.
