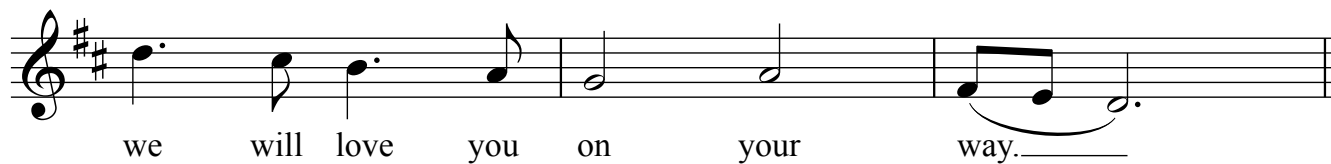
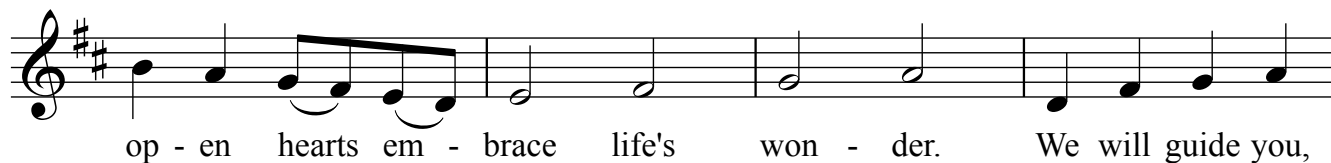

They have performed throughout the world, including at Carnegie Hall with Skitch Henderson and the New York Pops, and at the Vatican for Pope John Paul II. The choir's members are all students from middle school through college.
