March Share the Plate Recipient: Only a Child

Only a Child, founded in Guatemala City in 1993 by Arlington Street member George Leger, maintains a shelter and carpentry shop and ensures an education for street kids.

The shelter, housing up to a dozen young men at a time, is far more than a place to sleep; it provides a surrogate family in which the youth are taught responsibility and accountability and develop confidence and self-esteem.

All of them work, many of them in the on-site Only a Child carpentry shop, where they learn carpentry skills and produce finely crafted cedar boxes that they sell to support the program.

They also go to school. Arlington Street has supported the program from its inception. In a bid to maximize the kids' chances to leave the streets once and for all, we have sponsored their tuition at high-quality independent schools and at university.


