

May Ist Share the Plate

Today's Share the Plate will support two local organizations doing great work on the ground in Kenya with refugee relief, particularly for people who are LGBT*IQ.

RefugePoint, based in Cambridge, is an agency that stresses developing economic sustainability among refugee populations. It has had staff on the ground in Nairobi working with the LGBT*IQ refugee population there since August 2015. Funds are desperately needed to expand programs on small business development, safe housing for refugees, and sustainability. To our knowledge, no other aid agency has programming on the ground to help this vulnerable refugee population.

Spectrum Uganda Initiatives, which works with issues of HIV and health in Uganda, has maintained close contacts with many refugees in Nairobi. It is working with them to develop programs to assist with developing workable grassroots-led strategies for economic sustainability. John Wambere, who has lived in the United States since 2014, is a co-founder of Spectrum Uganda Initiatives. He maintains close contact with refugees living in both the camps and in Nairobi.
