# The Celebration of Flower Communion

The Flower Communion is a Unitarian ritual created by Rev. Norbert Capek, who founded the Unitarian Church in Czechoslovakia. He introduced this special service to that church on June 4, 1923. It honors the divinity within each of us through the sharing of flowers. Join us as we celebrate this beautiful ritual!
