TODAY'S SHARE THE PLATE: NATIONAL EDUCATION FOR ASSISTANCE DOG SERVICES (NEADS)

Founded in 1976, NEADS trains service dogs. Ninety to ninety-five percent of NEADS puppies are raised by inmates at New England prisons; train at the NEADS headquarters in Princeton, Massachusetts; and are then matched with adults and children seeking greater independence from physical and developmental disabilities. NEADS dogs are also matched with professional caregivers to provide therapeutic assistance in settings such as classrooms, hospitals, courthouses, and mental health practices. In addition, NEADS designed the Trauma Assistance Dog (TAD) program for veterans diagnosed



with combat-related post-traumatic stress. NEADS clients pledge to support the organization by raising \$8,000 to help sustain their programs. Today, our gifts are in celebration of our own Rev.
